From the Board of Directors

Hello Neighbors!

At its May meeting, the Board selected a professional engineer who specializes in roadway rehabilitation to assist the community in the first phase of our repaving project. He will monitor the technical aspects of the paving and prepare our Request For Proposal (RFP) for bids. Our community has used this type of service for past paving projects as well.

The projected timeline for the remainder of the process is noted below:

- Jun - Engineer completes RFP
- Jul - RFP sent out, responses received, board selects paving contractor
- Aug - Contract is signed and paving company puts us on their schedule

- Sep to Nov - Paving project is completed

The actual work should take seven to 14 days. The plan is to avoid paving on Halloween and around Thanksgiving.

Flag Etiquette

Following describes proper etiquette for use and display of our nation's flag:

- The flag should never touch anything beneath it when on display
- If displayed at night, the flag should be illuminated
- The flag should be cleaned and mended when necessary
- When a flag is worn to the point where it is no longer a fitting emblem, it should be destroyed in a ceremonious fashion, preferably by burning. Most American Legion posts accept flags for proper destruction.

Gardening Tips for June

Flowers

- Prune back tall growing perennials to control height. This also helps to remove aphids on plants; plants like gaura, salvia and others will flush back out and rebloom.
- Cut back petunias and snapdragons, and follow with a fertilizer application to encourage new growth and another bloom flush.
- Prune growing tips of poinsettias lightly to encourage a denser plant. Fertilize frequently with a liquid balanced fertilizer.

Lawns

- Plant/plug lawns now to fill in cold damaged areas. Go to <http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/lh013> for info. Do not plant new sod on top of old sod. This is a bad practice that will lead to disease problems.
- Calibrate your sprinkler system to water between 1/2" and 3/4" each time you water. Fol-

No persons under the age of 14 are allowed in the pool area without a parent or guardian (over 18) present. All children 14-17 must apply for a pool pass, with parent's permission, in order to access the pool area without adult supervision. Any parent interested in getting the pool pass for the children

low guidelines: odd # addresses on Wednesday & Saturday; even # addresses on Thursday & Sunday. No watering from 10 am to 4 pm. Water when the grass blades fold or when footprints linger after walking on the grass. Avoid mowing with heavy riding mowers when the lawn is drought stressed.

- Stay ahead of the weeds by hand pulling or spot treating as needed. For information on weed control, go to <https://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/ep141>.
- Check brown spots in lawns for irrigation problems or chinch bugs. Chinch bugs are already active and will show up in hot dry spots. Refer to <http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/lh036> for more info.

should contact the Woods Office for more information. The pool ID badges will be \$3.00 per badge. They must have the pool pass/ID in order to enter the pool area.

Toddlers and infants must wear Infant Swimming Resource (ISR)-approved reusable elastic diapers (NO disposable diapers). If your child defecates in the pool and the ISR-approved diapers were not being worn, there will be a \$100 charge to close the pool and clean it.

Important Announcements and Reminders



- ◆ **Watering:** Daylight Saving is in effect so we are operating under a **two-days-a-week** watering restriction. Odd-numbered homes water **only** on Wednesdays and Saturdays. Even-numbered homes water **only** on Thursdays and Sundays. There is to be **NO** watering between the hours of 10:00am and 4:00pm.
- ◆ **Recycling Collection Dates:** June 5, 19; July 3, 17, 31; Aug 14, 28; Sep 11, 25. Bulk pickup follows the same schedule as recycling. Do not place bins at the curb until 5:00 PM the evening before.
- ◆ **Lawn Debris** may be placed at the curb after 5:00 PM on Wednesdays. Do not block drains/gutters.
- ◆ **Cul De Sacs (common areas):** Use by residents for trash, lawn debris or parking is **expressly prohibited**. These are common areas. We ask that everyone keep this in mind. Please note that vehicles parked on any common area grass will be towed immediately once discovered by Woods' security personnel.
- ◆ **Do not put lawn clippings**, or any other debris, into any of the Woods' ponds.
- ◆ In order to assist the guards with more efficient entries, **residents are encouraged to use the Gate Sentry app** on their smart phones. Call the management Office if you have any questions.
- ◆ For **non-vehicular entry:** all persons entering the community on foot, bicycle, etc., must check in with the Gate guards and be prepared to show photo ID as proof of residency in the community.
- ◆ **Make Yourself Visible:** If you like to ride bikes, walk, or jog late in the day or at night, be sure to wear some light-colored (preferably reflective) clothing.
- ◆ Jacksonville Municipal Code requires that **pets must be on a leash or tether** when being walked by their owners. Both the law and common courtesy require that **pet owners immediately clean up any mess made by their pets**.
- ◆ **Animals not on a leash:** whether accompanied by the owner or not, should be reported immediately to the City of Jacksonville Animal Control at 630-2489.
- ◆ The Board has continued the JSO patrols throughout the community. That means **STOP at all stop signs and honor the 25 mph speed limit**.
- ◆ **REMINDER** - Keep your garage doors closed when not in use and make sure your vehicles are locked at all times.
- ◆ **DO NOT FEED THE GEESE THAT INHABIT THE PONDS AND LAWNS AROUND THE NEIGHBORHOOD.**
