Lawn and Garden Tips for October

What to Plant

Annuals/Bedding plants: Plant digitalis (foxglove), petunia, and shasta daisy in the fall garden.

Bulbs: Fragrant daffodil varieties for North Florida include 'Carlton', 'Fortune', 'Silver Chimes', 'Thalia', and 'Sweetness'.

Herbs: Some to try from plants or seed include dill, fennel, oregano, and sage.

Vegetables: Plant bulbing onions, salad crops such as arugula, lettuce, and spinach, as well as numerous other cool-season crops.

What to Do

Lawns: Control winter weeds in lawns before they appear. Preemergent herbicides must be applied at the right time to be effective. Apply when nighttime temps are 55°F–60°F for 4–5 days. Avoid "weed and feed" products.

Winter landscapes: Plant evergreen hollies; their bright berries add color to the landscape when

other plants have died back for the winter. Water well when planting and mulch to minimize weeds.

Pine needles: Gather pine needles that are dropping and use them as natural mulch.

Strawberries: This is the last month to set strawberry plants in the garden or in large containers. Either way, water daily until plants are established.

Lawns: Lawns start to lose color as the weather cools. If a green winter lawn is desired, overseed with annual ryegrass when daytime temps are in the low 70s, but keep in mind that watering and mowing will be required.

Lawn disease: Watch for brown patch and large patch, fungal diseases that cause areas of grass to turn brown. Since treatment is difficult, prevention with proper cultural practices is key. The disease becomes active when the soil temperature, measured 2–4 in. deep, is between 65°F and 75°F and goes dormant when the weather warms in May.

The Woods Fall 2017 Garage Sale

Every fall, The Women of The Woods hosts a garage sale, and this year the event will be on **November 4th from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m.** In case of rain, the garage sale will be rescheduled to the next day.

The map/detailed list is BACK and will be available at the gate. Participants will receive one with their balloons when they are distributed before the sale.

A \$5.00 CASH registration fee is mandatory for participation and will get your home's address included on a neighborhood map of participants with descriptions of your five top items for sale, a real bargain given all the benefits you receive in return. Your registration fee provides newspaper ads, provides signs around the boundaries of our neighborhood, supplies each registered household with an official Participant Packet including balloons and a map/detailed list. WOW also distributes yard sale participant lists to visitors the day of the event, and arranges for resident DROP-OFF of any used goods (no trash, please) to the Salvation Army truck stationed at the Clubhouse during and after the sale. Use this opportunity to get rid of a lot of cool stuff you no longer need, but could bless someone else in his or her household. Amazing publicity and the

incredible turnout of previous years always make for hundreds of eager customers. You keep all the money you make.

The \$5 cash fee is due by the end of day Friday, October 27th in order to give us time to include all participants on the list/map. A word of caution: the Garage Sale start time is somewhat flexible. If the line becomes long and begins to cause traffic problems, customers may be admitted as early as 7 a.m. Woods residents have been known to begin their shopping even earlier.

Important Announcements and Reminders

- **Watering:** Two-days-a-week watering is currently in effect. Odd-numbered homes may water **only** on Wednesdays and Saturdays. Even-numbered homes may water **only** on Thursdays & Sundays. There is to be **NO** watering between the hours of 10:00am and 4:00pm on any day. One-day-a-week watering returns in November.
- **Bulk pickup:** Follows the same schedule as recycling. You no longer need to call for a special pickup for most items.
- **Make Yourself Visible:** If you like to ride bikes, walk, or jog late in the day or at night, be sure to wear some light-colored (preferably reflective) clothing.
- **Cul De Sacs (common areas):** Use by residents for trash, lawn debris or parking is **expressly prohibited**. These are common areas. We ask that everyone keep this in mind. Please note that vehicles parked in these areas will be towed immediately once discovered by Woods' security personnel.
- The Board has extended and increased the JSO patrols throughout the community. That means **STOP at all stop signs and honor the 25 mph speed limit**. Several residents have already been recipients of tickets for violating these traffic rules.
- **NEW:** Do not to put lawn clippings, or any other debris, into any of the Woods' ponds.
- **NEW:** Do not feed the geese that inhabit the many ponds and lawns around the neighborhood.
